### 1. Welcome

Programme Lead Cary James welcomed everyone to the first campaign development group meeting for the new HPE programme. The development of the campaign will be done via the thousands of users who complete online questionnaires relating to *It Starts With Me* and via input from the campaign development group which will meet twice throughout the year.

## 2. HPE resources presentation

CJ gave a brief presentation on the findings from the recent HPE resources survey. Myth busting was the topic that people wanted to see in a new resource the most.

All of the training topics suggested were scored highly, with a few scoring slightly higher than others so these will be prioritised in the first year, with others to follow.

## 3. Concept for It Stars With Me 2016

CJ and representatives from PD3 gave an overview of the concept for the direction of ISWM into 2016 and beyond. Respondents were given three statements and the leading statement scored much higher amongst all.

#### 4. Groupwork

The group gave some feedback as to what emerging issues they see ahead, issues discussed included:

- Chemsex starting to reach areas outside of London
- Poor linkages with the pan-London HIV prevention programme, which should be rectified as a member of PLHPP will be on the HPE Steering Committee
- Knik-knax don't necessarily have to be HIV related, just an interesting and engaging conversation stater
- As more community specific venues close, resources which can be left out need to be more and more 'family' friendly
