




HIV and Trans people

Key populations: all face stigma, discrimination and punitive legal environments













HIV and Trans people

Meta-analysis of studies in both the USA & Asia-Pacific regions have generated a 49% higher likelihood of HIV infection in trans women

A Community Put At Risk

Silence = Exclusion = Erasure

- Trans women at high risk of having HIV especially trans women of colour who experience disproportionately high rates of HIV.
- Lack of inclusion in HIV Testing Campaigns
- Lack of information on HIV care and treatments relevant to transpeople in UK
- There is a gap in research on HIV and trans men; few studies have gathered HIV prevalence data for this population.

Because..Trans Health Matters and PrEP

- 44 trans people & their partners tested for HIV in late 2016
 - 54% UPAI in last 6 months

I haven't heard of PEP: 74%

I haven't heard of PrEP: 79%

I wouldn't take PrEP if it were available to me: 79%

(Cited concerns about reliability, interactions with hormes)

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HIV Testing & PrEP... Inclusive History Taking

Pronouns (How does the patient describe themselves)

Partners (What gender are your partners? (Any sex with cis men?)

Parts (Surgical history, use patient language)

Practices (Trans women as insertive partners/trans men as receptive partners etc.

Chems? Hormone use?)

Past history of STIs

Protection strategies (Informed by the above. Who has what parts? What protection is needed?)

Pregnancy prevention (Asked to non-trans women; trans men? Cytology/smear testing?)
