Pastor Tony Fawole is a Minister of Religion with over 15 years' experience in counselling, coaching and mentoring, and management. Prior to this, he worked for 30 years as an Administrator, Management Consultant and Policy Adviser both in the private and public sectors.

After a successful career in people management, Tony now coaches other people to achieve the same success. Tony

Call to action

Faith leaders have **positions**, **influence**, **power**, **authority**, and **compassion** that must be harnessed to create healthy and caring communities for people living with and affected by HIV (PLWHIV) as well as for the wider community

We want faith leaders and people of faith to:

Inform their communities that HIV must not be seen as punishment for sexual promiscuity

Break the silence, burst myths/eliminate misinformation-conversation about HIV/AIDS must begin in the pulpit and reach the pew so it can reverberate to the streets

Underscore the prevalence of this disease

Ensure people do not judge- Judge not (John 3:17---God sent his son into the world not to judge the world but to save the world through him.)

Ensure **people do not moralize** or ask how someone acquired HIV

People of faith and faith leaders are not to be obstacles to change, rather, they should be drivers of change.

How?

Through

Greater engagement and commitment in the HIV response. Recognition of the need to respond to people living with and affected by HIV in a way that reflects a **loving God** rather than a **judgmental**, **dismissive** God.

Learning and keeping abreast of HIV news so we can correct misinformation and protect PLWHIV Confidentiality-gaining and trust -building
