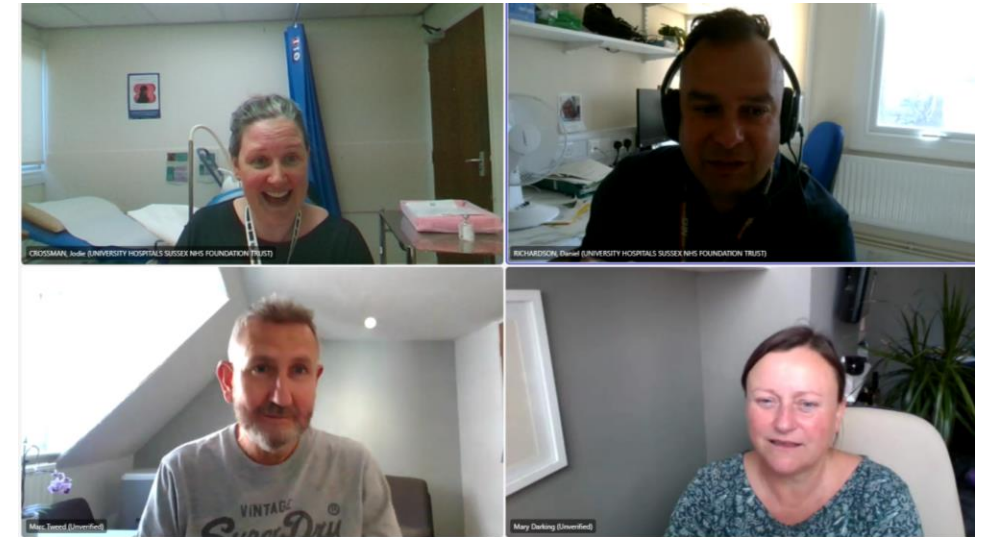
- High prevalence of HIV

- Lacking diversity in provision



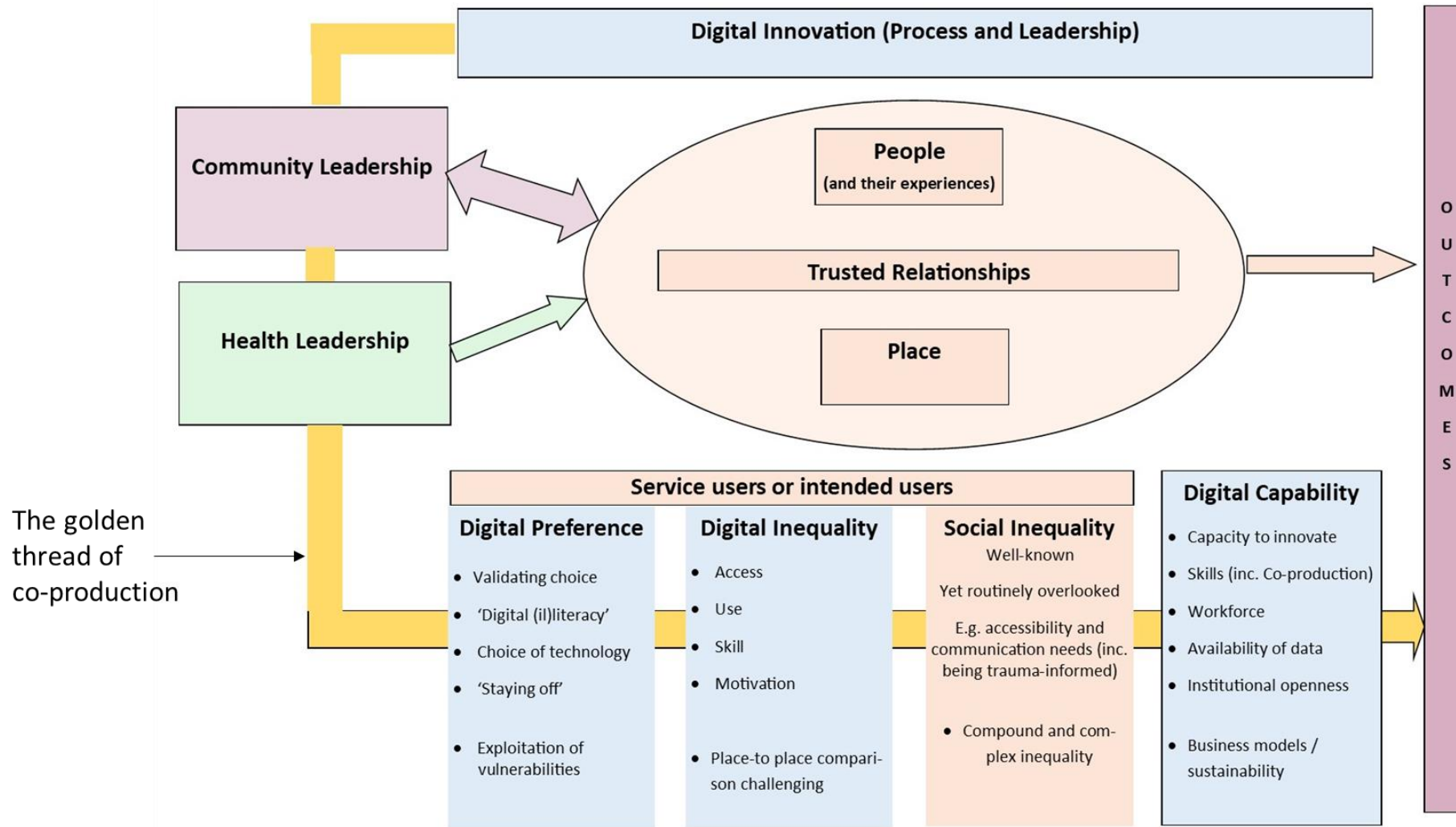
Sexual Health Innovation Pathways group

Co-designed, Community Engaged Approach

- **Gather** - insights, data and evidence from your under-served communities
- **Ask** - what do people know and think, what's not working?
- **Listen** - what are the differences in their care and support needs
- **Learn** - from service and non-service user journeys
- **Open** - a conversation with your communities
- **Plan** - pathways WITH your service users that work for them!

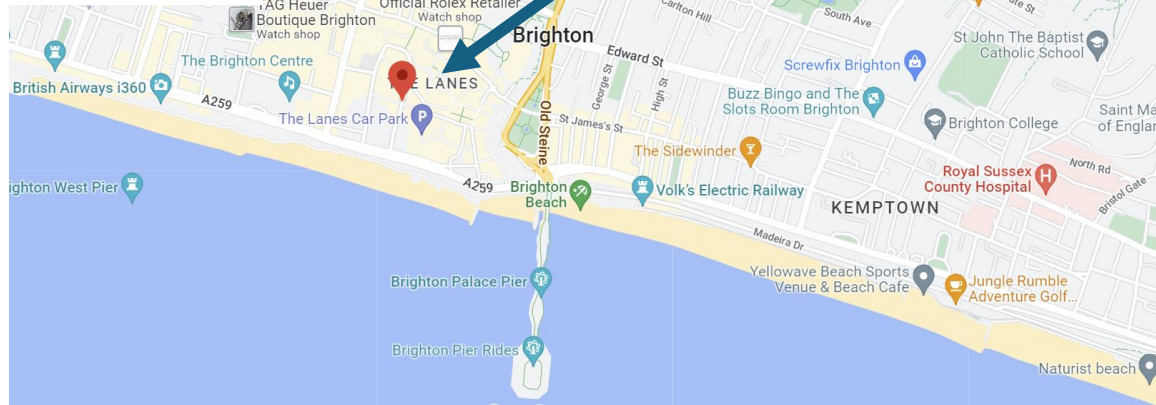
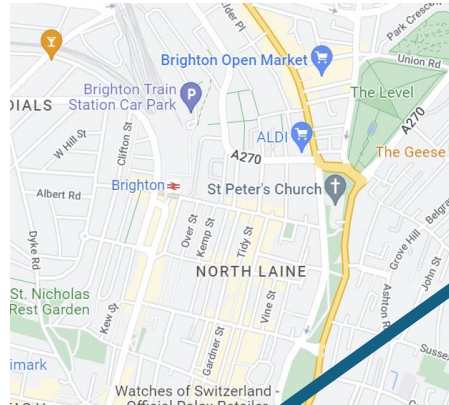
